What's Happening in Sunday School?


The readings for this week focus on the true interior of the heart and the consequences of disobedience. Empty gestures as discussed in the Isaiah reading do not make you righteous. In fact, they are an insult to God. Paul's letter tells us about the vengeance and punishment that await those who do not obey the Gospel. He praises the Thessalonians for their abundant faith. In the Gospel reading we see that even a sinful Zacchaeus can turn away from his sins and find salvation in Christ. The choices we make matter – even in a morally ambiguous society.

- In the Psalm, what does David say happened to him when he kept silent about his sin?
- How does Paul feel about the church in Thessalonica?
- Where did Zacchaeus go to get a good view of Jesus in Jericho? Why did he have to do this?
